

Nancy J. Newman, MD, Guest of Honor - Ophthalmology

Dr. Newman was appointed LeoDelle Jolley Chair of Ophthalmology by Emory University School of Medicine in February 2002. She also holds the positions of professor of Ophthalmology and Neurology, and instructor in Neurological Surgery at Emory University School of Medicine. She also is director, Section of Neuro-Ophthalmology, Emory Eye Center. Dr. Newman has more than 500 publications, including scientific articles, book chapters and books.

including the primary textbook in neuro-ophthalmology, Walsh & Hoyt's Clinical Neuro-Ophthalmology, 5th and 6th editions. She is co-author, with Dr.Valérie Biousse, of the textbook, Neuro-Ophthalmology Illustrated (Thieme), the first edition published in 2009, the second edition in 2016, and the third edition in 2020. She has served on the editorial boards of the American Journal of Ophthalmology, the Journal of the Neurological Sciences, Seminars in Neurology and the Journal of Neuro-Ophthalmology. She has lectured widely throughout the world and is known for her innovative teaching style. She sees both adults and children with neuro-ophthalmologic problems, such as optic nerve disorders, visual field defects and disorders of ocular motility. Her main research interests include disorders of the optic nerve and mitochondrial diseases. She served on the Board of Trustees of Princeton University for 14 years.



Carol L. Karp, MD Featured Speaker - Ophthalmology

Hailing from New York, Dr. Carol Karp completed her undergraduate education and medical school training at the Warren Alpert Medical School of Brown University. Dr. Karp went on to complete her ophthalmology residency training at the renowned Kellogg Eye Center at the University of Michigan.

This was followed by a fellowship in Cornea and External diseases at the premier Bascom Palmer Eye Institute. Dr. Karp subsequently joined the faculty at Bascom Palmer in 1994, where she has pioneered the use of interferon for the treatment for ocular surface squamous neoplasia and use of ultra-high resolution OCT as an 'optical biopsy' in the diagnosis of these tumors. Among the significant recognitions, Dr. Karp has received the honor of being voted one of America's best Eye Doctors by Newsweek in August 2021. She was named on the 2021 Power list as a top 100 woman in ophthalmology, by The Ophthalmologist, and had previously also was on the 2019 Power list as one of the top 50 most influential ophthalmologists. In addition, she was given the 2019 Shaler Richardson, MD, Service to Medicine Award from the Florida Society of Ophthalmology, recognized for greatest personal contribution to quality ophthalmic patient care.

Albert Merati, MD Guest of Honor Speaker – Otolaryngology

Dr. Merati is an internationally recognized leader in Otolaryngology-Head & Neck Surgery. Following medical school at the University of Washington under Charlie Cummings, he completed his Otolaryngology training at the University of California at San Diego, including one vear of NIH research training. From there. Dr. Merati went to

Vanderbilt to study Laryngology with Robert Ossoff at the premier training institution for academic laryngologists. This time at Vanderbilt included work with Jim Netterville on laryngeal framework surgery. Following very productive years at Kansas University and at the Medical College of Wisconsin, Dr. Merati returned to his native Seattle in 2007 to head up the Laryngology program at the University of Washington, now widely recognized among the leaders in clinical care, scholarship, and training in the nation. He has over 130 peer reviewed publications and also is the lead editor for the Textbook of Laryngology.
